This is a poster of Uncle Sam saying that people should enlist into the army.

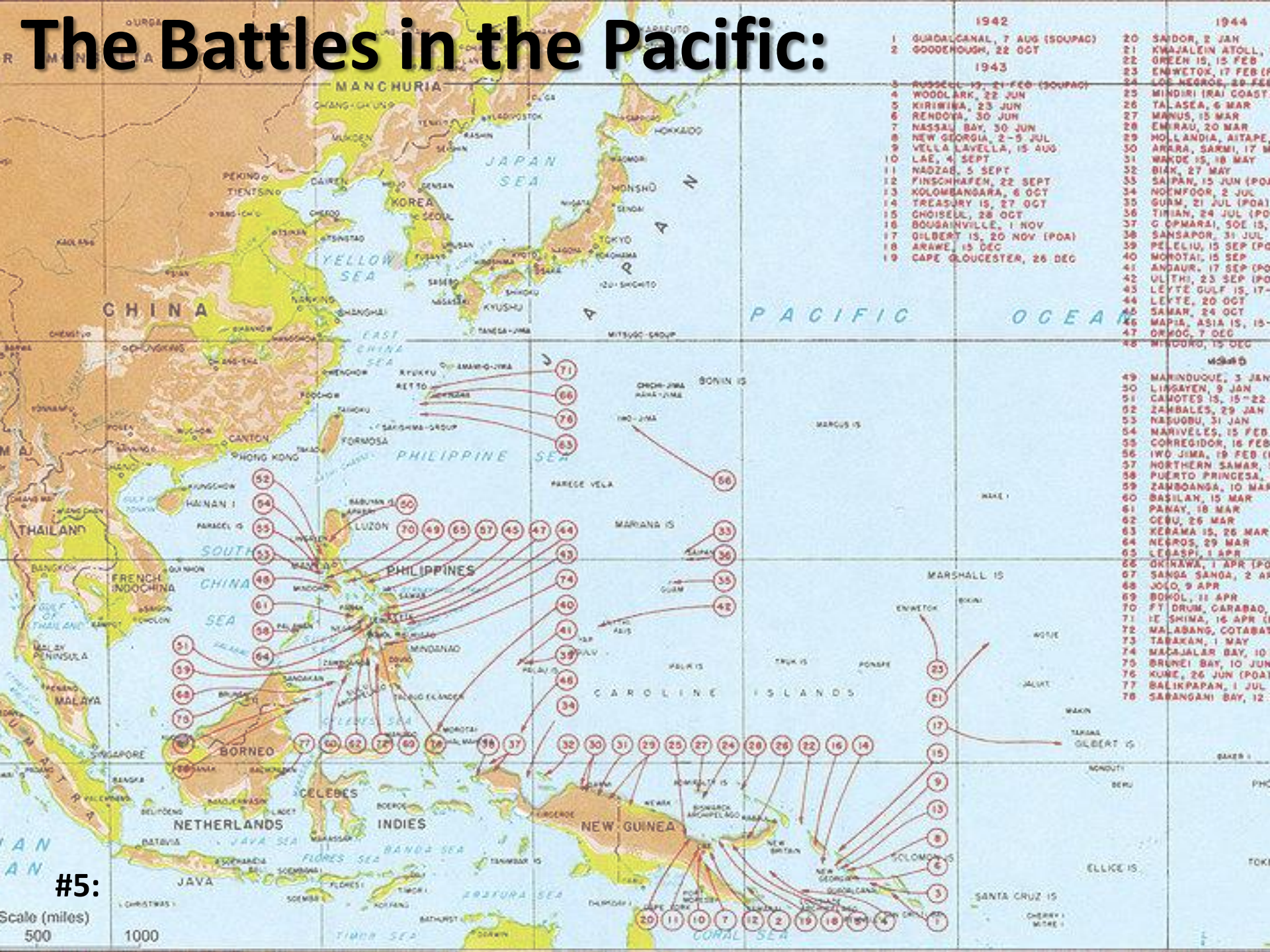

# Pearl Harbor:

- **Damages and Deaths:**

- **United States:**

- 4 battleships sunken, 4 damaged, including 1 run aground
- 2 destroyers sunken, 1 damaged
- 1 other ship sunken, 3 damaged
- 3 cruisers damaged
- 188 aircrafts destroyed, 155 aircrafts damaged
- 2,402 military killed, 1,247 military wounded
- 57 civilians killed, 35 civilians wounded

- **Japan:**

- 4 midget submarines sunken, 1 midget submarine run aground,
- 29 aircraft destroyed,
- 55 airmen killed
- 9 submariners killed, 1 submariner captured

## Overview:

- On **December 7, 1941**, the Empire of Japan launched a surprise attack on Pearl Harbor, in Hawaii, prompting the United States to join the Allies against the Axis powers, as well as the captivity of Japanese Americans by the thousands.

## The Battle of the Java Sea

#19:

- The **Battle of the Java Sea** was a major naval battle of the Pacific during World War II. Allied navies suffered a disastrous defeat against the Japanese Navy, on **February 27, 1942**.
- The American-British-Dutch-Australian Command (ABDA) commander, **Admiral Karel Doorman** was among one of the many who died.
- **Damages and Deaths:**
  - **United States:**
    - 2 cruisers sunken
    - 2 destroyers sunken and one damaged
    - 2,300 sailors killed
  - **Japan:**
    - 1 destroyer damaged

## The Battle of Coral Sea

- The Battle of the Coral Sea was fought in the waters southwest of the Solomon Islands and eastward from New Guinea on **May 4–8, 1942**.
- It was the first of the Pacific War's six fights between opposing aircraft carrier forces.
- It was fought between the **Japanese Navy** and **Australia and the U.S.**
- **Damages and Deaths:**
  - **United States:**
    - 2 fleet carriers damaged
    - 1 destroyer sunken
    - 1 oiler sunken
    - 69 aircraft destroyed
    - 656 killed
  - **Japan:**
    - 1 light carrier sunken
    - 1 destroyer sunken, 1 damaged
    - 3 small warships sunken, 2 damaged
    - 1 fleet carrier damaged
    - 92 aircraft destroyed
    - 966 killed

## The Battle of Midway

#18:



This picture shows oil tanks burning during the Battle of Midway.

- **The Battle of Midway** is usually regarded to as being the most important naval battle of the Pacific during WWII.
- On **June 4-7, 1942**, the United States Navy finally defeated an attack made by the Imperial Japanese Navy (IJN) against Midway Atoll.
- **Damages and Deaths:**
  - **United States:**
    - 1 carrier sunken
    - 1 destroyer sunk
    - 150 aircraft destroyed
    - 307 killed
  - **Japan:**
    - 4 carriers sunken
    - 1 cruiser sunken
    - 248 carrier aircraft destroyed
    - 3,057 killed

## The Battle of Savo Island

- The Battle of Savo Island, or **First Battle of Savo Island**, and known by the Japanese as the **First Battle of the Solomon Sea**, was a naval battle in the Pacific during WWII, between the Japanese Navy and Allied naval forces on **August 8-9, 1942**.
- **Damages and Deaths:**
  - **United States:**
    - 4 heavy cruisers sunken, 1 damaged
    - 2 destroyers damaged
    - 1,077 killed
  - **Japan:**
    - 3 cruisers moderately damaged
    - 58 killed

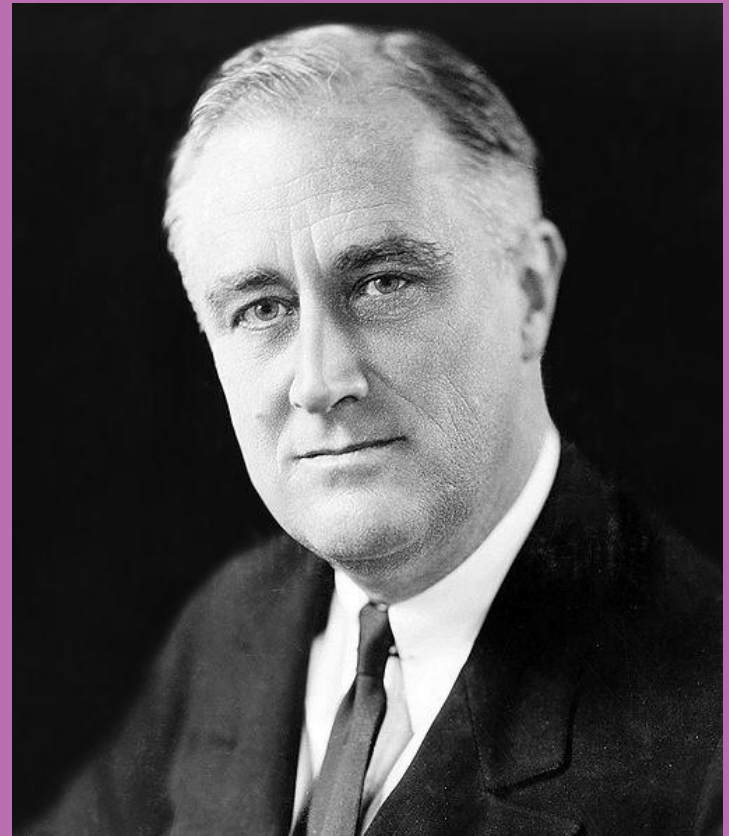
# American Political Leaders During 1942-1945



# Franklin D. Roosevelt

- He was born on January 30, 1882
- Worked closely with Winston Churchill and Joseph Stalin in leading the Allies against Germany and Japan in WWII.
- As World War II emerged after 1938, Franklin D. Roosevelt gave strong diplomatic and financial support to China and Britain, while remaining officially neutral. His goal was to make America the **“Arsenal of Democracy”** which would supply ammunition to the Allies.
- He died on April 12, 1945, just as victory for the U.S. and its allies was in sight.

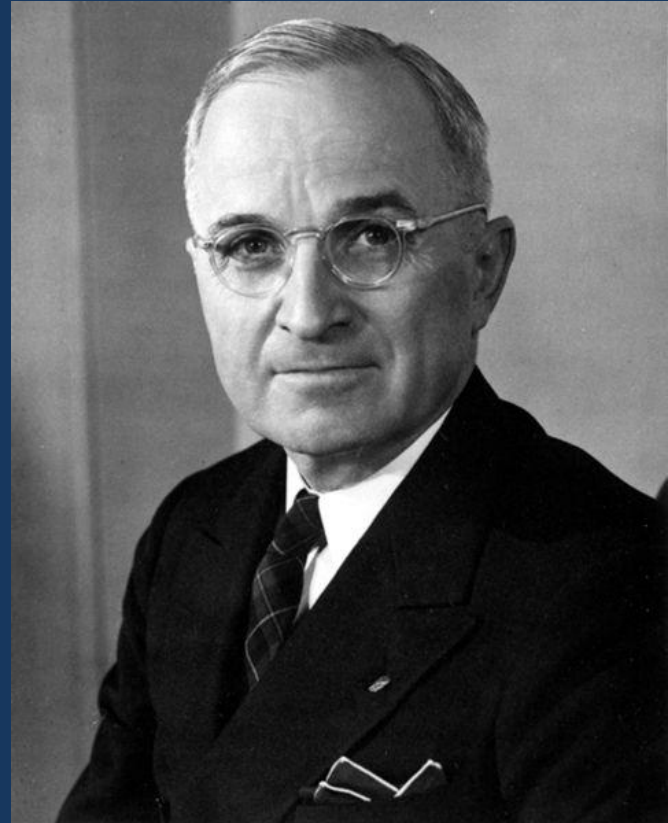


Franklin D. Roosevelt (FDR), the 32<sup>nd</sup> President of the United States.

# Harry S. Truman

#23:

- He was born on May 8, 1884.
- During WWI, he served as an artillery officer, making him the only president to be in combat during that time.
- After he gained a national reputation as head of wartime Truman Committee in 1944, he replaced vice president Henry A. Wallace, who was Roosevelt's first running mate.
- Upon President Roosevelt's death, he took over as the President.

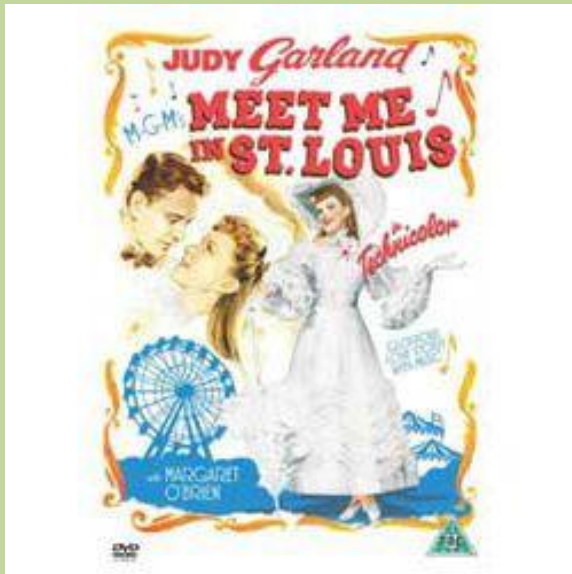

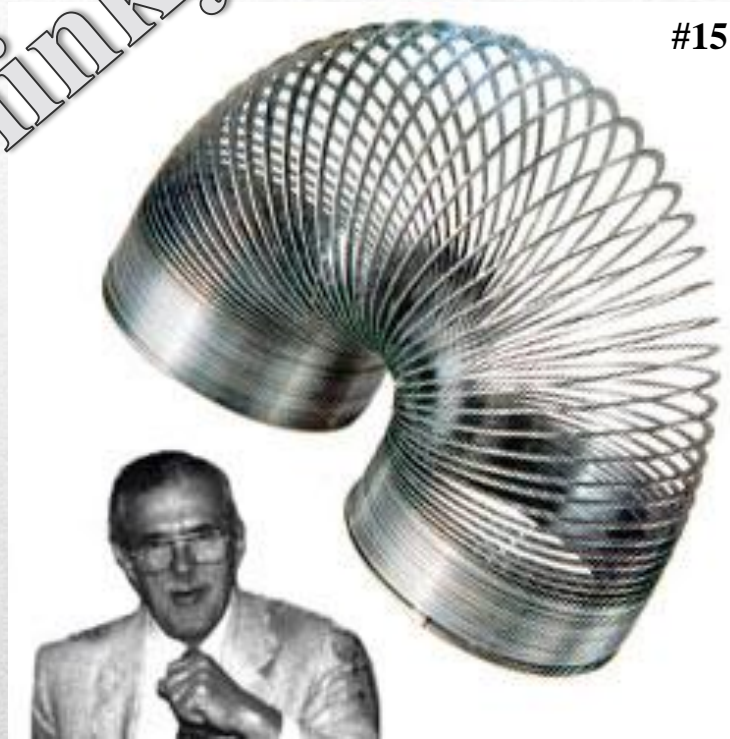

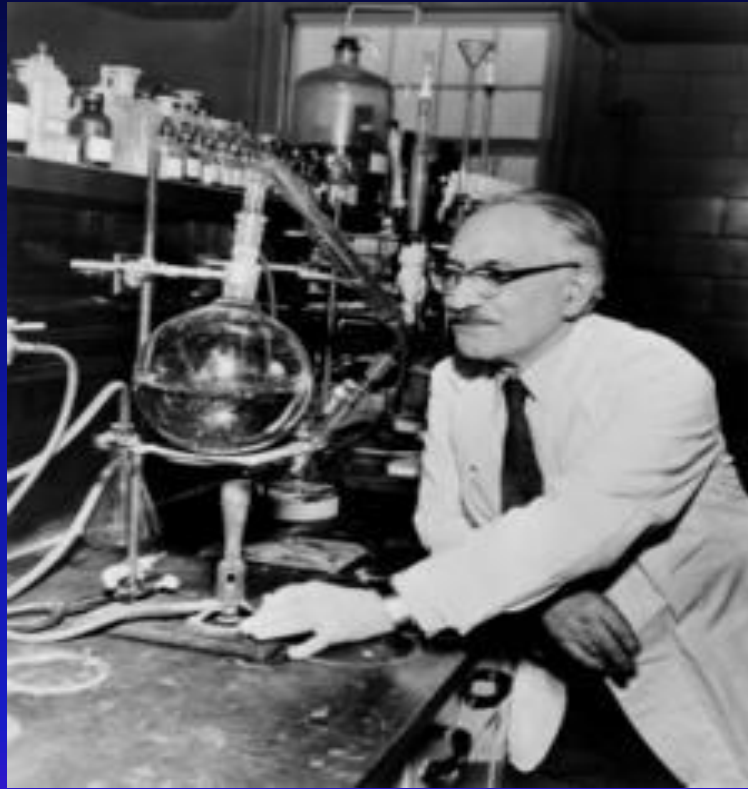
